Muslim Awareness Week (MAW)

Since the horrific attack on the Grande Mosquée in 2017, interfaith partners have come together every year for a week of dialogue and public education under the banner of Muslim Awareness Week (MAW). From the very beginning, Montreal City Mission has been a close partner in this initiative, and this past January was no exception.

MCM Director Rev. Paula Kline was honored to speak at the **MAW** launch at Montreal's City Hall, alongside Boufledja Benabdallah of the Grande Mosquée and Daniel Amar, Executive Director of the Montreal Holocaust Museum.

As part of the week's events, a panel discussion was held at St. James United Church, featuring Rev. Arlen Bonnar (pastor of St. James), Dr. Aimen Massoud (neurologist and peace activist), and Dr. Jean Panet-Raymond (sociologist). Centered on the theme "Fostering Connections", the discussion featured compelling testimonies from the panelists, followed by a lively exchange on faith, secularity, and our shared responsibility in breaking down stereotypes, building bridges, and nurturing harmonious relationships. Dr. Abbas Hammoud from the Muslim Association of Canada, also spoke eloquently during the St. James Sunday morning worship service prior to the event about the importance of reaching out across cultural and religious divides.

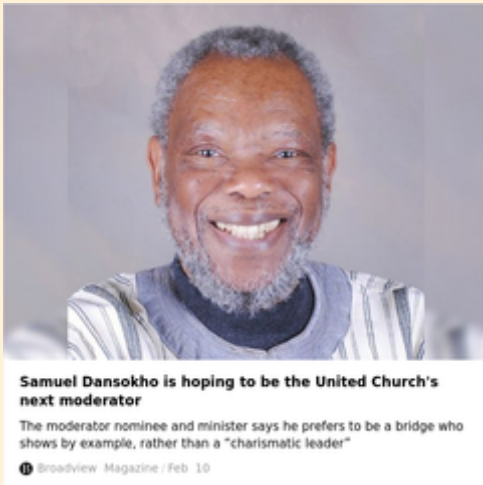

In Memoriam

Rev. Dorothy Louise Cunningham

Rev. Dorothy Louise Cunningham passed away February 14, 2025 at the age of 94 in Mississauga, Ontario. Dorothy was ordained a Minister of the United Church of Canada on June 2, 1971 (possibly one of the first female ministers in Montreal) and settled in the Longueuil – St. Hubert - Lafleche Pastoral Charge from 1971 to June 30, 1979. From July 1, 1979 to June 30, 1992 she was the Minister at Trinity United Church in Montreal. From September 1, 1992 – 1994 she ministered at the Shawbridge and Morin-Heights Pastoral Charge.

Dorothy served the Montreal Presbytery at various times and in different capacities: Chairperson of M.P.E., Chairperson of Education and Students, and Chairperson of Montreal Presbytery. She served as a member of the Conference Interview Board for the Montreal and Ottawa Conference, and was the Montreal and Ottawa representative to the General Council of the United Church of Canada (1990-1994).

REMINDER - NEW STRATEGIC INITIATIVE: Saying goodbye to oil!

As part of the strategic initiative of the United Church of Canada to reduce emissions from fossil fuels and in light of recent oil spill incidents at two churches in our Region resulting in remediation costs of close to \$1M, the Regional Council has undertaken an initiative to have all remaining heating systems in our churches that use oil, replaced.

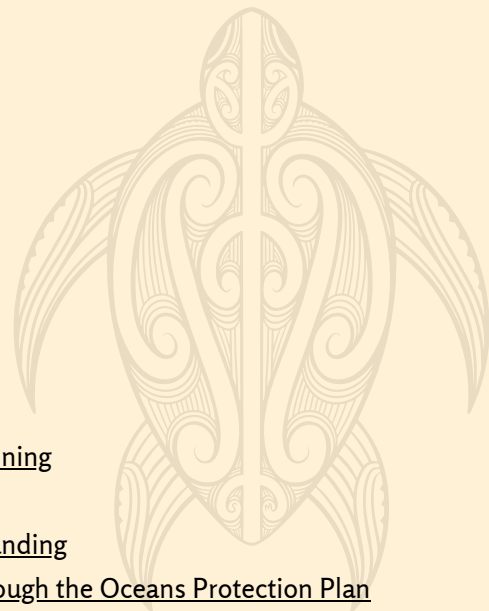

F&E Connexion

We're launching a new column talking about our region's Finance and Extension Board ("F&E" to most of you who know us), giving you news about our work and sharing how what we do at F&E connects with the life of your community of faith in the CrNRC territory.

Let's start with a bit of history: F&E was established as an independent corporate body by federal law in 1926 soon after the creation of the United Church of Canada. It merged the much older Presbyterian Board of Trustees of the Presbytery of Montreal and the Methodist Union of the City and Suburbs of Montreal and was designed to provide financial and organizational support to the mission of the new United Church.

Back in 1926, F&E was focused on the original Montreal Presbytery of the United Church but has expanded its responsibilities across Quebec as the boundaries of presbyteries shifted and the Church's new regional council structure was created. The constitution of F&E was updated in 2020 with the approval of the General Council of the United Church of Canada.

We have a broad mandate involving the stewardship of the financial and property resources of the Church in our region for ministry and mission. We're probably best known as the group that manages the F&E endowment (much more on that in a later column). However, our constitutional "objects and powers" go far beyond our fiduciary role, tasking us with the encouragement and support of ministry and mission more generally. That's the "extension" part of our name.

For example, the very first "object and power" in F&E's constitution is:

...to enable and facilitate by way of financial and material assistance and expertise, the extension of the United Church of Canada, including the visioning, transformation, establishment and reorganization of communities of faith of all types (including without limitation pastoral charges, congregations, outreach ministries, chaplaincies, faith-based communal living, house churches, online communities, and others), in accordance with the policies and decisions of the General Council and/or the Regional Council;

F&E is also charged with seeking "... to further the connexional spirit and to promote the spiritual and temporal welfare of the communities of faith and other ministries of the United Church of Canada..."

And no, that's not a typo in "connexional". That little "x" represents one of the deepest theological and organizational roots from our Methodist heritage. "Connexionalism" is the belief that the church is a network of interconnected relationships, where no congregation, community-based mission, or individual member is isolated. It emphasizes mutual support, accountability, and shared mission. This kind of connection (or "connexion" as John Wesley spelled it) strives for unity, pooling resources for outreach and ministry. Christians grow in faith and engagement through communal interaction, leading to spiritual growth and social-justice action that embodies the "connexion" among believers (and, often, with non-believers) to accomplish God's mission in the world.

REMINDER - Federal grant for increased security

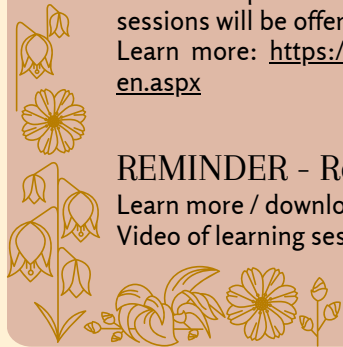

United Church Women Leading the Way!

For many communities of faith, their first centennial event may be the March 2nd worship led by United Church Women (U.C.W.). U.C.W.'s across Canada are dedicating that Sunday to remembering the faithful and dedicated service of women's organizations throughout the past 100 years of the church's life.
